- Students enjoyed the campaign 'Show Racism the Red Card' and particularly how it ended with a non-uniform day that enabled the whole school community to come together and show their views towards racism.
- Students enjoyed the whole school project for 'Make a Noise About Bullying' and felt it was beneficial to have all year groups involved in this campaign.
- Students like the posters and tutor postcards that are on display across the whole school and on tutor room doors. They feel that these visuals really reinforce our whole school message and ethos; they feel as if they act as a commitment to the campaigns by the tutor groups.
- Students enjoyed the variety of assemblies and tutor group activities that were linked to the campaigns; they felt it helped strengthen the exposure they were getting.
- Students enjoyed seeing Aspens come on board with different menus for 'Show Racism the Red Card'
- Students also enjoyed seeing the display in the LRC.

It has been decided that our campaign for after Christmas will be on 'e-safety' and what we don't know about Staying Safe Online. The student council are going to plan a range of sessions, to be delivered in tutor time, on e-safety which will cover some of the following ideas:

- 6. A quiz which will be based around fake news and safety
