Enrichment Projects

Although year 7 have a comprehensive home learning programme in place this booklet has been put together to provide opportunities for students to voluntarily take part in subject specific enrichment projects.

The projects will run each half term to provide an optional task that students can get involved in if they are interested in that subject. We would recommend that if a student would like to study a subject at GSCE level or above that they engage with those projects to help enhance their learning experience.

Students who take part in an enrichment project will be awarded certificates to celebrate what they have achieved and the effort they have put in.

All students will have the opportunity to take part but it is entirely optional.

Schedule of Enrichment Projects

Autumn 1 = Geography, Design (one project of Food/Product/Textiles to be on offer each term; choose which one is relevant).

Autumn 2 = English, Art and Expressive subject (one project of Music/Drama depending on your rotation)

Spring 1 = RE, Design (one project of Food/Product/Textiles to be on offer each term; choose which one is relevant).

Spring 2 = Science, Computing.

Summer 1 = History, Art and Expressive subject, Expressive subject (one project of Music/Drama depending on your rotation)

Summer 2 = Language (one project from French/Spanish), Design (one project of Food/Product/Textiles to be on offer each term; choose which one is relevant).

Further details of the projects will be provided by classroom teachers, however we have included the project outlines for you in the following pages. Please be aware the projects on offer may change to suit the students learning at the point at which they are set.

Art

Create a news report for the missing penguin. You can either write this as a script or get together with friends and rehearse it as an acting performance and film it.


You might want to include:

- An interview with the Head Zookeeper
- A witness report
- CCTV footage
- A message from the local police and a number to contact with further information and any sightings
- Any ideas of your own

Task: Carry out some primary research.

- Use the internet or visit to carry out some of your own research to find out what food products are already in the shops [existing products research]
- Type of product: picture and description
- Cost
- Where are they sold, what type of shop is it; a large super market, small local shop, farm shop etc.
- 2. Survey or interviews- write some questions to find out why consumers buy certain foods.


History



<u>Design Brief - Designing your dream bedroom layout</u>



You can use a range of different techniques to communicate your ideas—

Create a **card model of the room layout** using an old shoe box as the walls. This is a great way to show things in a 3D view.

Use Google Sketch Up to create a computer 3d model of the room and then use this model on a PowerPoint to help explain all the interesting features of the bedroom.

Create a costs list for your room using Excel to add all the costs up for the cool features and furniture that you will have in your room.

Draw a top down view of the room and include measurements of all the furniture so that you can communicate how everything will fit together.

Create a **point of sale display** that helps to display your desk tidy and catch people's attention in the shop

Philosophy Religion and Ethics Year 7 Enrichment

Faith Zone

In year 7 and 8 you look at many of the world faiths, what people think, believe, do, and why. This project supports you in your learning journey in PRE at The Purbeck School. For this project you will have **three** choices to either **design** your own faith of peace, or create a multi-faith respect zone for the community, or research one of the beliefs of the world and explain the key beliefs and practices.

Your task

Either

1 Design your own religious faith to bring about peace in the world

Imagine a new faith has been discovered, its aim is to bring about peace. You need to explain it to other people. You could design it on an A3 piece of paper with labels to explain what you have included, or write it as a booklet 'a guide to' explain it. You could make a film on it, or a model explaining it. In your faith you must include:

- Origins (how it began)
- Symbol
- Religious book
- Key beliefs
- Festivals
- Teachings

- * name
- * place of worship/ special place
- * leader
- * rules
- * holy place to visit
 - * name of followers

You should explain why the faith is important to its followers, and its teachings on peace and how to bring about peace, you need to explain each of the parts of the faith, i.e. the symbol, the rules etc.

Or

2) Respect zone

A plot of land has become available in Wareham. Wareham council have decided it to be a 'respect zone', a place where anyone can go. This space needs to reflect respect in the community and be somewhere people of all faiths or no faith would feel at peace. You could have an open space or a place which contains zones, think what will be in each zone, i.e. plants, seating, patterns colours, each zone could be for a different religion maybe with symbols, think about what will be in each zone and how it shows respect, think about the architecture, buildings or items for each zone. You may have a quote of respect for each zone. Ensure you create a welcome guide, rules, and then explain what you have included in each space. You could draw or make a model or video of your zone.

3) Beliefs of the world

1) Research in detail a belief of the world, which exists now or has existed here are some examples below you could research

* Christianity *Hinduism *Buddhism * Judaism * Sikhism

* Islam *Greek Gods * Egyptian Gods *Paganism *Baha'i

2) Create a resource to teach others about the belief that you have researched. It could be in the form of a booklet, leaflet or video, or any other way that you would like to present it. It must include an explanation of the following: what happens and why, the religious people; origins (beginning); symbols; place of worship; religious book leader; key beliefs; rules; festivals; holy places to visit and interesting facts. Number of followers, etc.

Finding information

There are lots of books in the Learning and Resources centre on religion which will help. If you are stuck do ask the librarian.

You should consider internet search engines (such as Google) but you must think about the source – Wikipedia can be edited by anyone!!
