

WHAT IS AN APPRENTICESHIP?

We've summed up the five main points that help to explain what makes up an apprenticeship.

An apprenticeship gives you the opportunity to combine on the job training with study meaning you can earn while you learn.

With some apprenticeships you can even get a degree.

It usually takes between one and four years to complete an apprenticeship depending on which level you take.

Apprenticeships are available across a wide range of industries and many high quality, prestigious companies offer them.

Pay is dependent on the industry, location and type of apprenticeship. The minimum wage for apprentices aged 16-18 is £3.50 per hour however many employers pay more than this and some higher apprenticeships can pay as much as £500 per week.

APPRENTICESHIPS: FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

When you're considering the next step to secure the future that's right for you, you're bound to have lots of questions. We're here to help.

What are the different levels of apprenticeship?

There are four types of apprenticeship: Intermediate, Advanced, Higher, and Degree. It will depend on the job role and your prior qualifications and experience as to which level you will need to start at.

Is getting an apprenticeship competitive?

Securing an apprenticeship is the same as getting any other job: there will be other applicants and you'll need to impress to get shortlisted. Stand out by researching the employer, identifying the skills and qualities that make you unique and tailoring your application form.

How does the application process work?

The organisation will usually advertise on the Find an apprenticeship website, so you will be able to apply online. After the closing date, the employer will shortlist the applicants. Interviews could be a mixture of face to face meetings, online tests, and assessment centres.



Do you need English and Maths?

Some employers ask for English and Maths GCSE before you start. However, if you don't have English and Maths it doesn't mean you can't do an apprenticeship. If you're willing to work towards Functional Skills then you will still be able to achieve your apprenticeship.

A guide to apprenticeships



What's an apprenticeship? It's a genuine job, with training, meaning you can earn while you learn and gain the necessary skills and professional competencies in your chosen career.

What can I earn?

The minimum wage for apprentices is £3.50 per hour, but many employers pay more than this. This is dependent on the sector, region and apprenticeship level e.g. some higher apprenticeships pay up to £500 per week.

What levels are there?

All apprenticeships include elements of on the job and off the job training leading to industry recognised standards or qualifications. Some apprenticeships also require an assessment at the end of the programme to assess the apprentice's ability and competence in their job role.

How do I apply?

At any one time there are up to 28,000 apprenticeship vacancies available online in a variety of careers and industries across England. Visit **GOV.UK** and search 'apprenticeships'. You can search by keyword (job role, occupation type or apprenticeship level) and by location.

Once the right job comes up, you can simply register on the website and follow the step by step instructions to apply for the role.

Not quite ready for an apprenticeship or job? You could try a traineeship with a local employer to gain valuable work experience and the opportunity to improve your English and maths, if needed. What's in it for me?

- Earn a real wage;
- Be trained in the skills employers want;
- You are more likely to progress quicker and higher than a typical student;
- Learn at a pace that suits you and be supported by a mentor;
- Have a holiday and be paid while you're away;
- You will set yourself up for the future – apprentices enjoy marked salary increases when they complete their training, and those completing a higher apprenticeship could see increased earnings of an estimated £150,000 over their lifetime.*

Entry requirements

Apprenticeships are available to anyone over the age of 16, living in England. There are different entry requirements depending on the sector and job.

Recent legislation has come into effect which changes the minimum English and maths requirements needed to complete an apprenticeship for people with a learning difficulty or disability. The changes will lower the English and maths requirements for these apprentices to an Entry Level 3 qualification.

A Disability Confident Employer will generally offer an interview to any applicant that declares they have a disability and meets the minimum criteria as defined by the employer. For more details search Disability Confident on gov.uk.

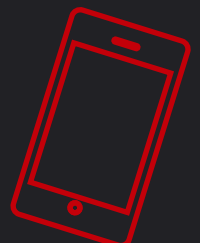

We've collected together the top five things you need to know about higher and degree apprenticeships.

1 What are higher and degree apprenticeships?

With the growth of higher and degree apprenticeships, young people and adults now have a real alternative to traditional university study. You will build your career, gain professional skills, status and accreditation all whilst being in a job and earning a salary.



2 A degree without the debt

Apprentices will not need to pay anything towards this fantastic opportunity as the Government have additional budget to fund the higher education qualifications that make up a higher apprenticeship.

3 What do the levels mean?

Levels 4 and 5 are equivalent to a Higher Education Certificate/ Diploma or a Foundation Degree, Level 6 is equivalent to a Bachelor's degree and Level 7 is equivalent to a Master's degree.



4 Designed by employers and universities

Employers have co-designed degree apprenticeships to make sure the course is relevant for the skills industry is looking for. Apprentices will split their time between studying and being in the workplace.



5 What subjects can you do?

A GUIDE TO HIGHER AND DEGREE APPRENTICESHIPS



Now there is a real alternative to traditional university study. With the growth of higher and degree apprenticeships, you can gain your qualification, learn professional skills, progress your career plus earn a wage, want to find out more?

With a degree apprenticeship you can achieve a full Bachelor's or Master's degree. And just like traditional degrees, an apprenticeship is a great route to a great career.

The facts

If you are over 16, live in England and are not in full-time education you can apply for an apprenticeship. Apprenticeships are available at intermediate, advanced, higher and degree levels.

All apprenticeships are genuine jobs so all apprentices earn a salary. You must be paid at least the national minimum apprenticeship wage and many employers pay significantly more. Apprentices should work enough hours each week so that they can undertake sufficient, regular training and on-the-job activity, search 'become an apprentice' on GOV.UK for further information. Entry requirements depend on the sector and prior skills. If you have achieved A-levels you may still be expected to start at intermediate or advanced level as some sectors, such as engineering, require you to build up your occupational skills.

How are they structured?

Higher and degree apprenticeships are available at levels 4-7. They combine work with study and may include a work-based, academic or combined qualification or a professional qualification relevant to the industry. Levels 4 and 5 are equivalent to a Higher Education Certificate/Diploma or a foundation degree, level 6 is equivalent to a Bachelor's degree and level 7 is equivalent to a Master's degree. Typically, higher apprentices study part-time at college, university or with a training provider. Apprenticeships take between one and five years to complete.

How do I find a higher or degree apprenticeship?

Over 240,000 workplaces employed an apprentice including Cap Gemini, Ford, ITV, Airbus, Rolls-Royce, Barclays and the BBC. With so many opportunities on offer you can find the apprenticeship that's right for you.
